Her cry excited me in disposition to smile, which gave my mouth a slight twist, or compression of the lips that is now observable in the busts which Wright afterward made."

13. Treasurer's Report: Steve Hinson for Dennis Gadley

- The end balance on January 31, 2024 was \$5,653.52.

14. Registrar's Report: Troy Bailey

- As of today we have 132 members in the Chapter.
- There is one application at National currently being reviewed.
- Introduced Gary Rhoades whose application will be mailed to National next week.
- At the State level there were 1,820 members at the start of 2023. At the start of 2024 there were 1,740 members. Most members typically drop out of membership because they forget to pay their dues. There is a considerable effort being made to contact members to pay their dues so they can be reinstated.

15. Americanism Committee: Gage Georgeff

- The Chapter scored 8,252 points for the Americanism scoresheet for 2023.
- The Chapter scored 5,759 points for the President General Streamer.
- The only category the Chapter scored zero points in was Youth Programs. We already have a participant for 2024 in the Poster Contest.

17. Color Guard Committee: Troy Bailey

- On May 18, 2024 in Mahoning County there will be a grave marking and memorial for Jacob Nagle, a Patriot and First Fleeter who joined the Continental Army at the age of 16 and later the Navy. Flyers are available for those wishing to attend.
- The First Presbyterian Church donated \$200 to the Chapter Color Guard for our participation in their 200th Anniversary activities. Troy Bailey asked for a motion to donate the \$200 toward the 250th Anniversary memorial marker that will be installed in July at the Jefferson Courthouse. Motion by Bob Kenyon, seconded by Ryan Bailey. Motion carried.

18. 250th Anniversary Committee: Troy Bailey

- We voted several years ago to participate in the Liberty Tree Planting. Ohio ordered 21 15' Liberty Trees from a company in New Hampshire. There was damage to the field these trees were growing in, so there is a good possibility that they will not be able to deliver the 21 trees to Ohio before July 4, 2026. Currently looking to see if another provider can be secured for this project.
- America 250 The Ashtabula County Commissioners and Troy Bailey formed a committee to plan and celebration in 2026 for the 250th anniversary. Meetings occur at the Ashtabula County Courthouse on the second floor. The next meeting is Wednesday, February 21st. All are welcome to come and help plan for the activities that will celebrate the 250th anniversary of our country.
